



Lakes Region Conservation Trust 2010 Guided Excursions

FRIDAY, JULY 23 Join LRCT for a Guided Hike to the Summit of Cople Crown!

This hike will follow the 2.6-mile Cople Crown Trail to the summit of Cople Crown, with spectacular views of Lake Winnepesaukee, the Belknaps, Lake Wentworth, the Ossipees, and the Sandwich Range to the west and north, and views from the eastern outlook to Moose Mountain and a vista towards the seacoast. The Lakes Region Conservation Trust acquired the 732 acres in Brookfield which comprise the Cople Crown Conservation Area in 1996.



Description: The 5.2-mile round-trip hike will follow the Cople Crown Trail through hardwood forests on fairly level/rolling old dirt roads and trails, then climb via a series of switchbacks along moderate/steeper terrain to the summit.

Details: The hike will begin at the end of Moose Mountain Road at 9 a.m. (*see directions below*). Art Slocum, LRCT Property Adopter for the Cople Crown Conservation Area, will be the lead guide for the hike. Bring lunch, snacks, and plenty of water, as well as a windbreaker, bug repellent, and sunscreen.

Directions: From Wolfeboro, follow NH Route 28 approximately 3 miles east to NH Route 109. Turn right on Route 109 and continue approximately 7.9 miles to Governor's Road in Brookfield. Turn right on Governor's Road and proceed 0.4 miles to Moose Mountain Road. Turn right on Moose Mountain Road and proceed 1.5 miles to the end of the pavement; park in the snowplow turnaround area.
