

PAGE HILL & GLORY HILL CONSERVATION AREAS

Conserved Property of the
Lakes Region Conservation Trust

Welcome to the Page Hill and Glory Hill Conservation Areas. This 472-acre property is covered primarily with northern hardwoods (birch, maple and oak), and with white pine, spruce and hemlock. The property was acquired by the Lakes Region Conservation Trust (LRCT) in 1997 and 2005 through two extraordinarily generous gifts of land.

In addition to providing wildlife habitat, the property offers trails for beginner to advanced mountain bikers.

These mountain bike trails were built by the New England Mountain Bike Association (NEMBA) starting in 2010. NEMBA has continued to maintain these mountain bike trails in partnership with LRCT. The trail network is shown on the trail map, and additional information about these trails can be found on the NEMBA website (www.nemba.org).

Three years and more than 1,200 hours of volunteer labor later, there is now a trail system covering more than seven miles between Page and Glory Hills, with plans to extend the network of trails to 15 miles.

Most of Page Hill has intermediate to advanced trails. The most technical trail, The Dude Abides, offers beautiful views at the highest elevation on the property. In addition to mountain bike trails, the property includes a snowmobile trail maintained by the Andover Snowmobile Club.



Directions:

From North (Plymouth):

- Take Route 93 South to exit 23.
- Turn right on NH-104 W towards Alexandria.
- Go through Bristol and take a left onto Cass Mill Rd. Road turns into Murray Hill Rd.

From East (Sandwich, Meredith):

- Take Route 104 towards Bristol.
- Left onto Cass Mill Rd. Road turns into Murray Hill Rd.

From South (Tilton):

- Follow US Route 3 South.
- Continue onto Route 3A towards Hills.
- Slight left onto Murray Hill Rd.

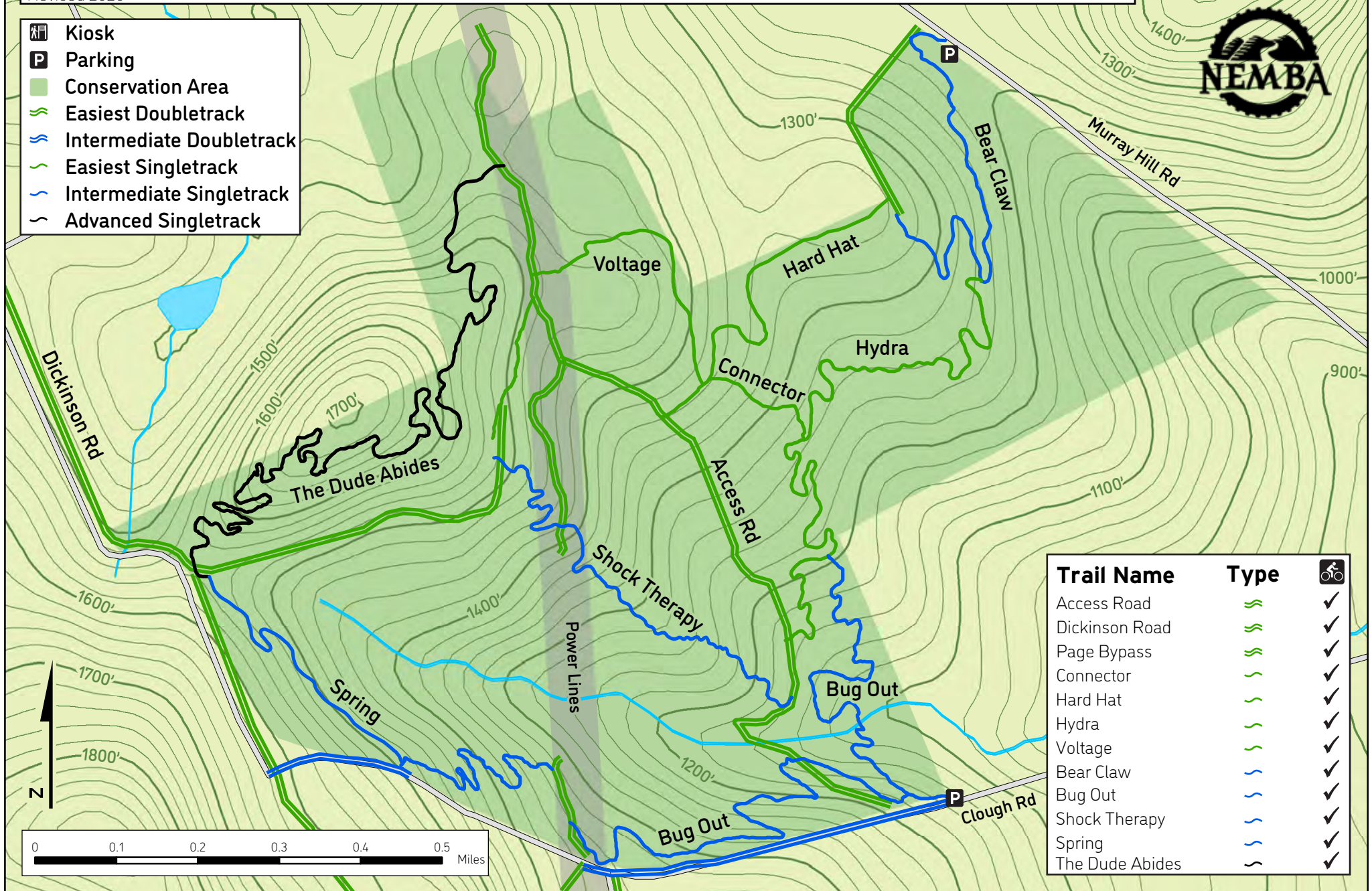
